Afyaplus Organization marks International World Water Day every year by preparing a special event known as the Afyaplus WASH Gala. This year's 3rd WASH Gala was held on March 24th, 2023, with the theme "It's Either Water or Water".

The main objective of the Afyaplus 3rd WASH Gala was to bring together various stakeholders to find sustainable solutions for improving WASH services in Iringa and raise funds to construct handwashing stations in 30 schools across the region, where eight children can wash their hands simultaneously. Presentation of speakers

In this event representatives from various WASH NGOs and institutions got a chance to share their ideas on different areas related to WASH services in the Iringa region. The issues presented were based on the accessibility, sustainability, governance structure, and financing model of water services and projects in rural areas.

The speakers included the ,Mr Vincent Kasuga World Vision zonal Manager TAWASANET Chairperson, Eng. Herbert Kashililah, RUWASA Manager of the Iringa region, Eng. Fredius Magige, and the Afyaplus member and Environmental Health Officer from Muhimbili Orthopaedic Institute(MOI), Mr.Simon Nchimbi. They all emphasized the importance of improving WASH services and the need for collaboration between stakeholders to achieve sustainable solutions.

Mr. Vincent Kasuga, Zonal Manager of World Vision, present at Afyaplus 3rd WASH Gala, shedding light on the current status, gaps, and necessary actions for improving water and sanitation accessibility in rural areas "Access to potable water and improved sanitation services is a topical issue in the global community development



agenda. This assertion is consistent with evidence that improved access to safe drinking water and sanitation is crucial to tackling health problems and promoting livelihoods in general, especially in rural communities"



Eng Fiderius Magige, Ruwasa Iringa Manager, speak at Afyaplus 3rd WASH Gala about the governance structure of water services in rural areas.

"Two major analytical models of the population not accessing water and nonfunctioning water points are generated by the micro integration decision (MID) tool, which had detailedly studied, each having 27 and 21 datasets respectively. A few numbers of wards have negligence numbers of disease

cases, especially cholera, dysentery, and trachoma, though profiled by the module packages by then, those cases were finally eliminated"

Afyaplus team member Simon Nchimbi shared Afyaplus' progress, success, and challenges during an Afyaplus 3" WASH Gala. And how our Water in schools project is making a huge difference in schools across the region.



"The issue of access to water from various sources and conservation of water is the responsibility of each and every one of us. Therefore, the government, stakeholders, and the community at large should work together to ensure the safety of our society."



TAWASANET Chair person Eng. Herberth kashililah shared а views on Sustainability of water sanitation and hygiene (WASH) facilities in rural areas. and Users' perceptions of the facilities and readiness to ensure the sustainability of facilities.

"The concept of water is sacred, which is why it has been extensively discussed in holy scriptures. That's why we need to ensure that water is accessible and distributed equitably based on demand in both urban and rural environments."

Panelist Discussion

The major aim of this discussion was to share experience and ideas towards sustainable solutions for improving WASH services in Iringa schools in order to increase health standards and ensure a favorable environment that increases children's school attendance and performance.

The panel of experts included Ms. Lilian Mreta, a senior Environmental Health Officer from the Ministry of Health and chair of the MHH Tanzania Coalition; Ms. Kokubelwa Samlelwa, an expert in water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) in schools; Ms. Faraja Chengula, an MHH expert and a young director with two years of experience in community work and MHH projects; and Ms. Shamim Nyanda Environmental Activist and Social scientist, Upendo Mwakyusa Environmental Scientist, climate and Enironmental advocate. Founder and Executive Director of call for environmental conservation Organization, and Afyaplus Executive Director, Ms. Suzan Yumbe, who each had over three years of experience in community work and MHH projects.

The panelist discussion was based on the accessibility, affordability, and quality of sanitary products, including disposable and reusable pads, which are among schoolgirls' concerns about academic performance. The panelist's team shared their challenges and ways forward, highlighting the need for increased support for menstrual hygiene management.

This discussion was so valuable as it helped to understand the challenges that school girls face in accessing affordable and quality sanitary products both disposable and reusable and its impacts on their school performance.

Afyaplus organization really appreciates the panelist team, leaders from local government authorities, school management teams, representatives from NGOs, Companies, institutes, and other invitees for their valuable contribution to how we can improve Water Sanitation and hygiene (WASH) services in schools of Iringa.
